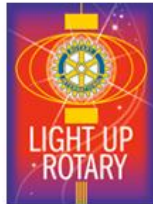

Annual Soup Luncheon Report October 16, 2014

As of Oct. 16, the Annual Soup Luncheon has raised \$2,044. This includes \$255 from tickets purchased at the door and \$127 from Split-the-Pot.

258 tickets were taken (11 less than last year): 207 from presales (35 less than last year), 51 from walk-ins (25 more than last year).

Thank you to the members with the highest ticket sales! Jim Hughes - 35 tickets (\$175), Steve Chamley - 20 (\$100)

The only expense was \$350 for the Masonic Temple rental. Everything else was donated. Ameristar donated salad, salad dressing, rolls, butter, crackers. HGM (Ron Tekippe, Jared Olson) donated flyers, signs, tickets. IWCC (Dan Kinney, Marcia Antworth) donated silverware, plates, bowls, cups, napkins. Northcrest Living Center (Steve Chamley) donated coffee and tea. The Red Cross (Jill Orton) donated use of beverage coolers. Hoy-Kilnoski (Mike Hoy) and Maher-Livingston (Mike Maher) donated 300 placemats that had polio facts on them. A big thank you to these generous donors!

Thank you also to Jon Leu for the Oct. 14 article in The Daily Nonpareil that promoted both the soup lunch and polio awareness. The Nonpareil also took pictures the day of the luncheon - pictures were in the Nonpareil on Oct. 18 and 19.

Proceeds will go to Rotary International's PolioPlus program.

It is important that EVERY MEMBER pay for their tickets so we can meet our commitment to PolioPlus. As of Oct. 16, 45 members still owe \$25 for their ticket purchases which translates to \$1,125. Reminders were emailed 10/20/14.
