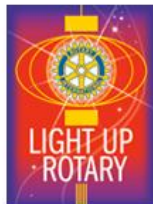

## **October 23 Program Special Olympics Iowa**

"Let me win. But if I cannot win, let me be brave in the attempt." -Special Olympics Athlete Oath

Over 12,000 athletes and unified partners are served in all 99 counties of Iowa. The organization is supported by more than 15,000 state-wide volunteers including 1,878 coaches, 300+ law enforcement and 15 area director volunteers. There are 16 state office employees. 78% of every dollar directly supports athletes. Training & competitions are offered 12 months of the year. There are 22 coach training clinics, 71 area competitions and 8 statewide championships.

There are 23 Olympic-style sports:

Athletes range in age from 2 to 99 years of age - 66.2% are 19 and older, 33.8% are 18 and under. 39% are female, 61% are male.

#### **Special Programs**

- Athlete Leadership Programs
  - Global Messenger - Teaches athletes to deliver speeches about Special Olympics Iowa and how it has changed their lives. Iowa has 50 global messengers.
  - Athlete Leadership Workshop - Develops skills for athletes to serve in leadership roles.
- Challenge Days - More than 400 adult and child athletes with severe and profound intellectual disabilities participate every year, where they compete in various activities.
- Healthy Athletes - Screening program offered during Summer Games and the Mid-Winter Tournament to improve greater overall health and fitness of the athletes.
  - Last year there were: 1,156 health screenings, 216 MedFest Athlete Exams, 202 Volunteers, 70 doctors & medical professionals.
  - Disciplines: Fit Feet, FUN Fitness, Health Promotion, Healthy Hearing, MedFest, Opening Eyes, Special Smiles.
- Unified Sports - Dedicated to promoting social inclusion through shared sports training and competition, where

people with and without disabilities participate on the same team.

- 2,200+ athletes, 18 events.
- College Locations: Buena Vista University, Cornell College, Drake University, Grinnell College, University of Iowa, Upper Iowa University, Wartburg College.
- Young Athletes - Focuses on fun, the development of motor skills and hand-eye coordination for children ages 2 1/2 to 7 and serves as an introduction to the world of Special Olympics. 751 young athletes participated in Iowa last year.
