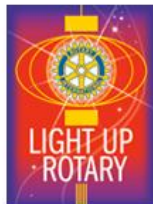

Vocational Talk

Misty Miller

Who is Misty Miller in her own words:

Slightly, over half a century ago, I was born to Mickey and Kay Miller, who already had an 18-month-old daughter named Tracy. We lived in Garden City, Kansas. It was a misty day at dawn and so they named me Misty Dawn Miller. That was a story as a little girl that I loved to hear my dad tell until one day he said, "You know Misty, you actually were born in the afternoon on a sunny day. "What!" I said. That kind of burst my bubble on the origin of my name for a while. Two years after me, my brother, Tal, joined the family.

We left Garden City after my kindergarten year for my dad's job. For the next three years, we moved and lived in three different cities in Kansas until my fourth grade year when we moved back to Garden City. My parents decided to divorce. My dad remained in Garden City to work on his family farm and the rest of us moved to Sergeant Bluff, Iowa where my mom took a job with the March of Dimes in Sioux City, Iowa. Any of you that have had family working for a non-profit know what it is like to volunteer – first, because you have to and then later because you want to. I actually volunteered for the March of Dimes in different capacities for over 30 years. My volunteerism didn't stop there and through the years I have volunteered for various organizations to help friends, family and the community.

I started my career with Iowa Public Service (a predecessor of MidAmerican Energy) in 1984 as a production clerk at the power plant located south of Sioux City. I worked in that position for four years before taking a job as a clerk in the storeroom at the plant for almost four years.

In 1991, I was promoted to the position of executive assistant for the Vice-President of Gas at the downtown headquarters. Over the course of 12 years, I worked for three different executives responsible for departments in the areas of gas and electric operations, rates, regulatory affairs and community development.

In 2003, I accepted the position of supervisor of office support and was responsible for mail services, document center and reception services and also assumed duties that included special events and storm restoration logistics.

In January 2011, I accepted the position of supervisor of customer office and meter reading in the Council Bluffs office. Remember the flood of 2011? Well, beginning in June, I was kept busy with coordinating the customer office and meter reading move to the Mall of the Bluffs where we stayed until November. Thankfully my past positions helped me be successful in my duties of a new job and responsibilities of a major event.

In May 2012, I became a key account manager assigned to MidAmerican's large industrial and commercial accounts. There are two of us located in the Council Bluffs office. I love my job! I enjoy the people I work with and am enjoying developing both work and personal relationships with my assigned customers.

Outside of work and during the time I was an executive assistant, I attended Briar Cliff University as a non-traditional student, graduating with a BS in Business, all while I was raising my two-year-old daughter as a single parent. I am thankful for family and friends that helped me unconditionally through this time in my life.

My daughter, Kayla, has a four-year-old daughter, Sophia, who calls me Nana Sunshine and she is my Sunshine Girl. We got these names through singing the song, "You are my Sunshine." They live in Sioux City. Kayla is studying to become an RN and hopefully move to Council Bluffs in the future.

My newest adventure is becoming a member of the Council Bluffs Rotary. As I stated earlier, I have volunteered for many organizations through the years and believe in being of service to others and helping in our community. Becoming a member will help me get to know more people, form new friendships and continue to be of service to others.
