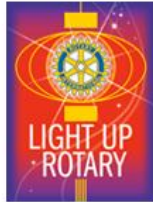

April 2 Program 100 Year Project Kick Off Mick McKinley & Larry Foster

Our Rotary Club was officially 100 years old as of April 1, 2015. That's quite a milestone! How many things do you know of that are 100 years old? Particularly a volunteer organization whose members change from year to year, decade to decade. We are still here, still active, still doing good things in our community and around the world!

All of us should be very proud that we are part of this club and its history. If we do our job, it will last another 100 years. Rotary is an organization that brings out the best in all of us and the things we do as Rotarians will have a lasting effect on Council Bluffs.

We have selected a special project to commemorate our 100 year anniversary and the attached PowerPoint will give you a better vision of the project, how it came together, who the strategic partners are, and how you can help.

Many of us have fond memories of Fairmount Park. In Mick's case, after talking with old band mates, he realized he played a concert in the park back in 1971 and, according to the newspaper, 3,000 people attended!

The Club has committed to raise \$100,000 towards the building of the park's new water playground. \$100,000 seemed very appropriate in light of our 100 year anniversary; and, with your help, it is very attainable. It is a tangible number that has served as a catalyst to get a \$1 million project off the ground to revitalize a great asset of the City.

There will be a series of three signs at the park which will provide the history of the Club, allow for imagery such as the Rotary logo, and room to acknowledge the support and generosity of our donors.

There is a series of levels of commitment:

Platinum: \$10,000

Gold: \$5,000

Silver: \$2,500

Bronze: \$1,000

Donations under \$1,000 will be acknowledged in the program for the grand opening of the water playground.

Our hope is that each member of the club will commit to a minimum \$1,000 donation which can be made over a 3 year period. We realize \$334 a year may be a stretch for some members but we only have one chance to do a meaningful 100 year project so any help is appreciated.

The donor commitment form is attached. Please take a look. Think about your memories of the park, think about what the park can be again. Thank you for helping to keep Rotary the premier service organization in Council Bluffs and in the world!
