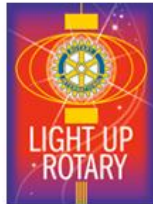

July 24 Program Historic Dodge House

Home on the Frontier:

- Dodge came to Council Bluffs following the railroad in 1853. During his lifetime he engaged in the mercantile business, organized a bank, surveyed the Missouri River Valley to the West for the Transcontinental Railroad, served a term in the U.S. Congress, and served with distinction in the Civil War, attaining the rank of Major General.
- Mrs. Ruth Anne Dodge was born in Peru, Illinois in 1833. She Married Grenville M. Dodge in 1854 in Salem,

Massachusetts. Her ancestry dates to the Mayflower and Governor Bradford, the first governor of Plymouth.

- The home was built in 1869 for \$35,000.
- The architect was William Boyington - the same architect that designed Terrace Hill in Des Moines, now the Governor's mansion.
- The home was very modern for the time - it had central heating and hot & cold running water.

Historic General Dodge House Today:

- Restored 2009-2012
- First historic landmark in Council Bluffs
- Oldest museum in Council Bluffs
- 2014 is its 50th Anniversary
- Open for tours: Tue.-Sat., 10 am-5 pm; Sun., 1-5 pm
